I. Call to Order

The PBAC Vice-Chairperson called the meeting to order at 1:30 PM for the National Survey on the Awareness of Government Entities on the PCA and the PCC under Request for Expression of Interest (REI) No. 201907-0135 at PCC Meeting Room 3.

 PBAC through its secretariat presented and discussed the Part I of the Pre-Bidding conference – Eligibility Documents (Technical and Financial Components). The proper sealing and marking of the Bidding documents and the procurement general rules and procedures were likewise discussed. 	
 Part II of the Pre-Bidding conference – Technical Specification / Terms of Reference was presented and discussed by the end-user (Economics Office). 	
B. Project Description and Technical Requirements	
 The survey aims to determine the awareness of government entities on the PCC and its mandate, and their level of involvement in PCC-related activities. The respondents of the survey will be NGAs, LGUs and GOCCs ("Government Entities"). The survey will be national in scope representing the four broad regions: National Capital Region, Balance Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao. The survey results will guide the PCC in designing strategies to enhance its advocacy, and to help educate the government entities on the contribution of market competition in improving consumer welfare and in enhancing market efficiency. E. Question and Answer	Agreements
The following questions/ concerns were raised during the meeting: 1. Mr. Meinardo M. Teves of EON, Inc. queried on how technical the requirement for the sampling frame is.	The Terms of Reference (TOR) requires that the respondents be from NGAs, LGUs and GOCCs, hence, a list of the names and contact details will be part of the sampling requirement. The bidder can propose the sampling frame that would best serve the interest of the PCC, in consideration of the time and budgetary constraints, and without compromising the results of
Ms. Camille Reyes from the Nielsen Company asked whether the respondents as regards the LGUs will include the barangay level.	As regards the LGUs, respondents will include up to municipal level and exclude barangay level.
 Ms. Ina Nocheseda of PSRC queried on the level or positions of the target respondents required from the NGA, LGUs and GOCCs. 	The target respondents should be involved in high-level management decisions either individually or as part of a decision-making group. The respondent should at least hold a middle management position.
	For target respondents from National Government Agencies, and Government Owned and Controlled Corporations, respondents should have been in the organization for at least six (6) months.
	A supplemental bid bulletin shall be issued to clarify the matter.

4.	Mr. Teves also asked whether the PCC will provide endorsement letters to the target respondents.	Yes, the PCC may issue endorsement letters to aid the conduct of surveys.
5.	In relation to Section II.2.e of the Terms of Reference pertaining to the Scope of Works, Mr. Jeffrey Gatdula of ASCEND asked whether there is a need to secure a clearance from the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA). Based on their previous conduct of awareness survey, it took them one and a half month to secure the said clearance.	The End User will assist in coordinating with the PSA and request the simultaneous conduct of survey pending the issuance of the clearance.
6.	As regards the provision in the Philippine Bidding Documents on the prohibition on subcontracting, Ms. Reyes sought for reconsideration considering that survey firms usually engage the services of another agency for the provision of field researchers.	The service provider may be allowed to subcontract but shall be limited to field researchers only. Nonetheless, it was clarified that despite the subcontracting, the winning service provider will be solely accountable to PCC. This will be included in the issuance of bid bulletin.
7.	Mr. Gatdula clarified the reckoning period for the 120 days validity of the Bid Security.	The date of opening of bids is the reckoning period.
8.	Atty. Rodrigo Celicious of ASCEND inquired whether the issuance of endorsement letters to target respondents will strengthen or weaken the results of the survey.	The issuance of endorsement letters is discretionary depending on the strategy of the survey firms.
9.	Considering the principle of confidentiality, Mr. Teves clarified that survey firms cannot divulge the names and contact details of the respondents of the survey to PCC. Ms. Nocheseda added that said non-disclosure of information is in compliance with Data Privacy Act.	A consent clause will be included in the questionnaire explicitly providing that subject information may only be disclosed to PCC.
10.	Ms. Nocheseda queried on the possibility of extending the three (3) months timeline for the project.	The timeline for the project is generally non-extendible. Extensions may only be given for unforeseen events and matters beyond the control of the service provider. The identification of respondents is considered a controllable
11.	Ms. Nocheseda queried whether the PCC will provide or has preference as regards the division of sample size.	factor. The survey firm has the discretion on the design of

12. Ms. Nocheseda also clarified whether there can be multiple respondents from one government entity/unit (NGAs, LGUS, GOCCs).	No, only one respondent from each government entity/unit.

 Clarification on the on the level or positions of the target respondents required from the NGA, LGUs and GOCCs. Clarification on the allowance of subcontracting but shall be limited to field researchers.
